

LONDON UNDERGROUND

WESTINGHOUSE CUBIC

Prototype machines were installed at Vauxhall and commissioned on 31st October 1982. There were 2 ticket office, 1 'Allfare' and 2 'Tenfare' machines. The Tenfare machines had buttons corresponding to 10 fares, a button was pressed and a display showed the fare that decreased as coins were inserted. The ticket was issued together with any change.

The Allfare machine had buttons for every station and buttons for adult and child, single and returns. The station was selected followed by the ticket type. The machine was programmed to issue Cheap Day Returns after 10am Mondays to Fridays, child flat fares on Saturdays and Sundays and the adult maximum fare on Sundays. Tickets showed the station name and fare between 2 horizontal lines. Below this was the ticket type, date, fare (again), machine number and ticket number. Thermal printing was used. Issued tickets from machines 10001 to 10008 have been seen, but only 5 were provided at any time. The machines were removed by July 1983.
